This is a reminder that if you are traveling on a UofT activity (gaining credit/research, funding or sanctioning) it is compulsory to <u>register with the Safety Abroad Office</u>. We ask that all students try to register one month before their departure date to ensure that they have completed the following requisite steps:

- <u>Safety Abroad Workshop</u> (valid for 1.5 years)
- Waivers \*a new waiver must be filled in for each overseas activity\*
- Safety Abroad Database \*each trip must be registered, fill in this form to do so\*
- Obtain travel health insurance
