The Division of General Surgery, Department of Surgery, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University is seeking a candidate for the role of Academic Breast Surgeon and Medical Director of the Norton and Lucille Wolfe Breast Care Center, St Joseph Health Care. This is a full-time Limited Term Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor, or a Continuing Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, depending upon experience and qualifications at the time of appointment. The Division of General Surgery is affiliated with London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care London and is presently comprised of nineteen surgeons with busy clinical practices. The Division has a strong clinical research interest and is an accredited Royal College training program.

The Norton and Lucille Breast Care Center (BCC) at St Joseph Health Care consolidated the majority of breast care for London and region in 2012. The center is a fully integrated ambulatory unit including diagnostic imaging, breast surgery and reconstructive surgery providing exemplary patient center care. It is a high volume center performing 13,700 screening mammography, assessing 8000 patients and performing 800 operations per year. Strong research links include the London Breast and Prostate Biobank located at St Joseph Health Care, Lawson Research Institute and London Regional Cancer Program.

The successful candidate will provide outstanding vision and leadership to the BCC. The candidate will lead the unique integrated program to national and international recognition in patient care, education and research. The candidate will provide leadership to strategic planning, quality initiatives, operational programs and budget planning of the BCC. The candidate will represent the BCC with regional partners including London Regional Cancer Program, regional hospitals, LHIN and Cancer Care Ontario.

The candidate must have a strong research interest in breast disease and strong leadership skills. Applicants considered at the rank of Associate or Full Professor must have demonstrated the ability to publish in the highest quality academic and subspecialty journals and be a recognized expert in their field of research.

The successful candidate must have an MD or equivalent; have completed an accredited general surgery training program; have advanced training in breast disease or a recognized surgical oncology fellowship and be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario and at least 5 years of experience. Previous leadership position or leadership training required.

Compensation for this position will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and will be primarily composed of the following sources: Fee for service (OHIP billings), Alternative Funding Plan, academic salary, specialty review funding and leadership stipend.

London is Canada's 10th largest city with a population of 400,000, a catchment area of 2 million, and is situated in southwestern Ontario between Toronto and Detroit. The region has a diverse economy and excellent educational opportunities. It is a safe and diverse city and its numerous parks, trails, recreational, cultural and sporting opportunities make it an attractive place to live. Western University is a research-intensive university with full-time enrolment of about 34,000 students with a full range of academic and professional programs.
