

# Disaster Simulation 2012

## *For all PGY1 – PGY5 residents*

**Scenario:** A chlorine tanker explosion near a filled stadium. People get exposed, panic, and many are actual injured trying to flee the stadium. The team will deliver 100+ victims to an already filled ED for the residents and nurses to manage. Families will follow.

Over 200 participants will participate in the exercise designed by Dr. Laurie Mazurik, an Emergency and Transport Medicine Transport Physician, along with an interprofessional expert team.

**Participants:** Actual staff from hospitals, including MD's, RN's, PA's, medics Social workers, and other allied health workers. Residents from both the University of Toronto and McMaster Emergency Medicine program. Students from many of Centennial College including health, security, technology, and media are also participating both as simulated casualties and in support staff.
